Combustible dust discussions - United Nations, Geneva

IGTC joined Gafta, IBTA, NGFA, NAEGA, CIARA-CEC and other participants last week's Sub-Committee of Experts on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals at the UN Palais des Nations, Geneva. The group is working with

government officials in order to secure the most practical and workable provisions for the development of an annex addressing dust explosion hazards.

ISPM advocacy strategy: implementation through regional and national IGTC members

With just two months to go before the IPPC's Expert Working Group on the ISPM for the international movement of grain (September 19-23, Melbourne, Australia), the IGTC is coordinating actions for national and regional members to undertake supporting industry advocacy across the world. The common objective is to work with the IPPC to secure the most

World Trade Outlook Indicator

The WTO has launched a new World Trade Outlook Indicator (WTOI) designed to provide "real time" information on trends in global trade. Updated on a quarterly basis, the WTOI signals turning points in world merchandise trade volume, focussing on key drivers of trade including agricultural raw materials.

The IPPC's 1st meeting of the Expert Working Group (EWG) for the International Movement of Grain (ISPM) will be attended by a select group of governments and industry representatives, including Dr. Marcel Bruins, IGTC Senior Science Advisor.

The EU has issued a communication (here) to governments on the WTO's SPS Committee, explaining its on-going process to review maximum residue levels (MRLs) for pesticides, and describing how non-EU countries can actively contribute to the reviewing process. The review will be tackled along with other issues at a WTO workshop on pesticide MRLs on 24-25 October.

Other issues at the 1 July SPS Committee in Geneva included EU and Chinese biotech approvals; as well as the deadlock between WTO members on private phytosanitary certification schemes, and how they may/may not be implicated in the WTO's SPS agreement. A report from the meeting can be read here.
