

### **Cartagena Biosafety Protocol**



MAINSTREAMING BIODIVERSITY FOR WELL-BEING CONVENTION ON BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY





- 170 Parties, more than 85% of the world's grain trade
- Covers movement of LMOs, risk management, socioeconomic considerations, precautionary principle....
  - IGTC aim: sound decisions that do not undermine the cost-effective worldwide movement of grains, oilseeds, pulses and other agri-bulks
- 8 countries/regional blocks reached by IGTC – meetings arranged on site



# **Unintentional/illegal TBM**

### Operational definitions to be endorsed in December (non-legislative!)

"Illegal transboundary movement" is a transboundary movement carried out in contravention of the domestic measures to implement the Protocol that have been adopted by the affected Party;


"Unintentional transboundary movement" is a transboundary movement of a living modified organism that has inadvertently crossed the national borders of a Party whereby the living modified organism was released either deliberately or accidentally. IGTC agreed a response to the draft decision on Article 17, covering:

- a) Definitions of "unintentional" and "illegal" transboundary movement
- b) The scope of the Article and its application to food, feed and processing
- c) Capacity building activities around sampling and testing



# Low Level Presence (LLP)

- LLP is highly likely. Zero presence impractical
- LLP polices are required because of growth of biotech crops and acreage
- Solutions must retain 'fungibility' of commodity
- Segregation is practically unachievable without enormous cost



A record 18 million farmers, in 28 countries, planted 181.5 million hectares (448 million acres) in 2014, a sustained increase of 3 to 4% or 6.3 million hectares (~16 million acres) over 2013.




Figure 1. Global Map of Biotech Crop Countries and Mega-Countries in 2015

## **Expected to address:**

- Actions prior to export
- Actions at export and import
- Science and risk analysis
- Audit provisions
- Transparency provisions
- Effective enforcement
- Pest risk assessment
- Industry practices that contribute to the management of risks

# **IGTC** aim:

Provide for the use of Most trade enabling & Least trade distortive measures ⇒while improving trade and official practice – including plant health protection

# **Priorities:**

- Testing & sampling based on international standards
- Import checks without undue delay
- Minimization of importing parties' ability to use protectionist measures to restrict trade
- Banning of arbitrary measures, going beyond int. standard requirements
- Accountability for all actors in value chain on including unnecessary import conditions
