NEWS

China Trade

NAEGA continues to monitor the implementation of the U.S.-China Phase 1 agreement. Despite the COVID-19 outbreak, the U.S. government continues to be optimistic that China will meet its goals under Phase 1. Two weeks ago <u>China lifted its ban on U.S. poultry</u> and on Tuesday, March 10, U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue <u>stated that</u> actions such as the lifting of the poultry ban and the announcement that China was opening a new tariff exclusion process were signs that <u>"China is taking steps to fulfill their purchase commitments"</u>, despite concerns that COVID-19 may make it difficult for China to fulfill its agricultural purchase commitments.

China's State Council Tariff Commission (SCCTC) <u>has opened a new tariff exclusion process</u> for Chinese companies impacted by retaliatory tariffs levied by China. To assist applicants, SCCTC has released a step-by-step guide to the online tariff exclusion application system. Applicants must be China-based enterprises and submit their applications through the Ministry of Finance (MOF) website. The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Foreign Agriculture Service (FAS) <u>has provided an unofficial translation</u> of China's step-by-step guide to tariff exclusion to help familiarize the U.S. food and agricultural industry with the process. FAS also has more information regarding <u>Chinese tariff exclusions here</u>.

<u>China has also notified</u> the World Trade Organization SPS Committee of 642 maximum residue limits (MRLs) on 65 pesticides in food. The draft MRLs cover a broad scope of food products, including horticultural products, oilseeds, grains, poultry meat and products, and eggs. The U.S. Department of Agriculture has provided <u>a list of all proposed MRLs here</u>. The deadline for comments is March 21, 2020. China has not announced a proposed date of entry into force for the MRLs. Comments can be submitted to China's SPS Enquiry Point at sps@aqsiq.gov.cn.

NAEGA continues to monitor for any reporting of force majeure certificates, <u>issued by the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade</u> to businesses in China if their businesses with overseas partners have been affected by the virus outbreak, impacting the bulk commodity trade. NAEGA also will be looking into contract implications and we appreciate member advice on how we might assist.

NAEGA is providing leadership, advice and coordination across the value chain. **NAEGA Member input remains critical and needed** to identify practices to support a more efficient trade. Canadian Parliament Passes USMCA

Canada on Friday, March 13 formally approved the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA), taking the last legislative step to implementation of the deal to replace the 25-year-old North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

The trade deal, ratified by the Mexican legislature last June and by the U.S. Congress in January, was <u>formally ratified by the Canadian Senate</u>, and shortly thereafter received royal assent, the Canadian governor general's approval. U.S. Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer, in a letter to the U.S. Congress on Wednesday, sent notice of an entry-into-force date of June 1 for USMCA. NAEGA will now engage with implementation of the agreement.

Iran Humanitarian Trade

In the February 19, 2020 edition of OUTREACH, NAEGA reported on the first successful pilot transaction, in January of 2020, under the proposed Swiss Humanitarian Trade Arrangement (SHTA), a payment mechanism designed to enable the delivery of humanitarian goods to Iran, was completed Switzerland began developing the SHTA in fall of 2018, with the cooperation of relevant U.S. and Iranian authorities, along with selected Swiss and interested banks. SHTA is designed to ensure that exporters and trading companies in the food, pharmaceutical and medical sectors have a secure payment channel with a Swiss bank through which payments for their exports are guaranteed.

On February 27, 2020, the U.S. Office of Foreign Assess (OFAC) issued General License No 8 (GL8), "Authorizing Certain Humanitarian Trade Transactions Involving the Central Bank of Iran." GL 8 officially authorizes the SHTA payment mechanism for the delivery of humanitarian good to Iran. The Swiss Government issued a press release the same day announcing the SHTA mechanism was up and running. OFAC also released a series of FAQs for companies wishing to use SHTA. Ongoing Opportunities & Actions:

U.S. ITC Investigation of MRL Impacts on Trade

The U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC) has begun an investigation into the global economic impact of maximum residue level (MRL) policies for pesticides. In response to a request by the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR), ITC indicated that MRLs, particularly those that are missing or low, can serve as barriers to U.S. agricultural exports. The ITC states it will issues two reports, one on April 30, 2020, and one on November 2, 2020, which will contain information on:

- The role of plant protection products and their MRLs in relation to global production, international trade, and food safety for consumers.
- The approaches taken in setting national and international MRLs for crops risk-based approach vs. hazard-based approach.
- How MRLs are developed and administered in major markets for U.S. agricultural exports.
- Challenges and concerns faced by exporting countries in meeting importing country MRLs.
- The costs and effects of MRL compliance and non-compliance for producers.
- How missing and low MRLs affect production, exports, farmer income, and prices, both on the national level and, to the extent possible, for small and medium-sized farms.

Written submissions for the first report are now closed. Submissions for the second report are due June 5, 2020. The notice from ITC can be found here.

Impact of U.S. Sanctions Compliance

NAEGA continues to seek guidance from Member Company personnel about how OFAC and sanctions compliance is impacting the trade and how NAEGA might best engage on this issue to advance member interests. Complying with new sanctions has become a regular part of international trade, and member input is helping us develop an approach that would alleviate industry concerns while ensuring compliance with OFAC regulation. We are thankful for input we have already received and encourage members who are dealing with these issues and have yet to comment to reach out to NAEGA has we begin to develop a plan of action.
