

USDA/FAS ESRMS 2.1 Outreach Sessions

The USDA/FAS Export Sales Reporting team will hold three Outreach Sessions between February 23-March 23, 2023, to give exporters a chance to provide input on how to improve the Export Sales Reporting and Maintenance System 2.1 (ESRMS 2.1).

The sessions will include a brief demonstration of the current ESRMS 2.1 design and facilitate a discussion about the best ways to upload exporter data into ESRMS 2.1. FAS requests that

companies that will use ESRMS 2.1 ask your respective <u>data-entry personnel and IT teams</u> to attend one of the sessions to give them the opportunity to ask any questions on the ESRMS 2.1 structure and how it may or may not work with your existing system(s).

FAS requests that personnel who will be using the ESRMS 2.1 plan on attending at least one of the sessions. There is no limit to how many sessions one can attend.

Recent Actions:

Comments to U.S. Government on Biotechnology

<u>NAEGA</u> joined industry partners in responding to a Request for Information (RFI) from the U.S. White House Office of Science & Technology Policy (OSTP) <u>seeking relevant data and</u> information to help identify regulatory ambiguities, gaps, inefficiencies, or uncertainties in the Coordinated Framework for the Regulation of Biotechnology (Coordinated Framework).

The comments commend OSTP for undertaking a review of the Coordinated Framework and recommended the following changes and improvements: Mandatory Notification when a new gene-edited or transgenic product is released into the commercial market; reorganization of the U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA) to improve structure, leadership, culture, transparency, and accountability within the FDA's human foods program; Bringing additional agencies into the

Coordinated Framework, such as USDA's Foreign Agriculture Service, to take international markets into account when considering a new gene-edited or transgenic product; and including clear and simple communication and guidance when conducting oversight.

MAP Travel to London, United Kingdom – January 17-21, 2023

NAEGA President Gary C. Martin traveled to London, United Kingdom, from January 17-21, 2023. While in London Gary advanced NAEGA's Unified Export Strategy objectives by advancing communication on best commercial and official practices, including international regulatory coordination and compatibility at several meetings and events. Gary attended, took part and presented at events surrounding the 57th Session of the International Grains Council (IGC), including participation in a panel discussion on grain trade in the Black Sea region and in an open discussion with the IGC Chairperson on sustainability in the grains value chain during IGC's Grain Forum. MAP Travel to Geneva, Switzerland– February 13-17, 2023

NAEGA President Gary C. Martin is traveling to Geneva, Switzerland through February 17, 2023. The trip's primary purpose is to meet with NAEGA and International Grain Trade Coalition (IGTC) Stakeholders and vendors based in Geneva. Additionally, Mr. Martin and NAEGA Geneva Envoy Mariya-Khrystyna Koziy are working to arrange discussions with other decision leaders and government officials, including USDA/FAS Post regarding the global grain trade and food security.

News:

APHIS Amends Karnal Bunt Regulated Areas

USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) amended the Karnal bunt regulated areas in the U.S. for 2023. Following a review of the results of the 2022 survey of Karnal bunt-regulated areas, APHIS is reducing the regulated area in La Paz, Maricopa, and Pinal Counties in Arizona. <u>APHIS publishes a revised Karnal bunt quarantine area description and a map of regulated areas annually</u>. APHIS regulates this plant disease because many trading partners require that U.S. wheat be certified as grown in areas free of Karnal bunt. Xochitl Torres Small Nominated to Serve as Deputy U.S. Secretary of Agriculture

U.S. President Joe Biden has nominated current Under Secretary of Agriculture for Rural Development Xochitl Torres Small to serve as Deputy Secretary of Agriculture. She would replace current Deputy Secretary Jewel Bronaugh, who recently announced plans to step down. Under Secretary Small will need to be confirmed by the U.S. Senate for this post. She received bipartisan support when the Senate approved her nomination to her current post in 2021.

Plant Biotechnology Information Exchange (PBIE)

There are currently 2765 transgenic products from approximately 415 unique transgenic events and 491gene edited products in the <u>NAEGA PBIE</u>.

Developed by and at the request of membership, the PBIE contains detailed information on commercialized and pre-commercialized gene-edited and transgenic seeds used to produce the crops you use and market. Currently, only NAEGA members have access to this unique tool. As part of membership, your company is allowed up to five unique users for the PBIE at no cost.
